SCAM WARNING



Fraudsters stole over £1M from victims using Amazon Prime scam calls

Action Fraud has received over 500 reports about an automated call scam impersonating Amazon. The recipient of the call is informed that fraudsters have used their personal details to subscribe to an Amazon Prime subscription, and are instructed to "press 1" if they'd like to cancel the purchase. When victims do this, they are automatically connected to criminals posing as Amazon custom service representatives who attempt to remotely access the victim's computer in order to steal personal and financial details.

Never install any software as a result of a cold call. Unsolicited requests for remote access to your computer should always raise a red flag.

Always question uninvited approaches in case it's a scam. Instead, contact the company directly using a known email or phone number. Have the confidence to refuse unusual requests for personal or financial information. It's easy to feel embarrassed when faced with unexpected or complex conversations. But it's okay to stop the discussion if you do not feel in control of it.

- Display a 'No Cold Calling Home' sticker •
- Not expecting visitors? There's no need to open the door, it's ok and not rude to send them away
 - Set up passwords with utility companies
 - Keep the outside of your property well maintained
- Don't keep large amounts of cash at home


